Wisconsin Native Vote hosts mural unveiling event in Milwaukee to get out the Native vote

MILWAUKEE – On Friday, Oct. 21 at 1 p.m. Wisconsin Native Vote, a program of Wisconsin Conservation Voices, will host a mural unveiling at the Gerald L. Ignace Indian Health Center to get out the Native Vote.

The event will bring together Native people and supporters from across the state to celebrate Indigenous peoples' traditions, honor our ancestors, stress the importance of healing in the community, and make a plan to vote for the seventh generation.

The mural, created by artist Christopher Sweet (Ho-Chunk/Ojibwe), shows imagery of land, water, and a jingle dress dancer that represents healing. The seven individuals holding hands in the air signify unity, diversity, achievement, and the seven generations.

The event will feature artist Christopher Sweet and notable Native speakers and performances from the community.

Milwaukee is home to the largest concentration of Native people in the state, with a diverse population from tribes around Wisconsin and the country. This event brings those communities together to heal and celebrate the right to vote.
